I. Call to Order

NSTC Liaison Gene Whitney called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

II. Approval of Minutes

Members approved the July 1st meeting minutes.

III. Summary of Discussion

A. Report from the SDR Chair

SDR Chair Helen Wood was unable to attend the meeting; Dr. Gene Whitney led the meeting in her stead.

B. Report from the NSTC Liaison

Dr. Gene Whitney began his report by announcing the National Academies Disasters Roundtable, "Creating a Disaster Resilient America: Grand Challenges in Science and Technology." This workshop, created in partnership with the SDR, is an opportunity to take a holistic look at the challenges hazards pose to the nation. Federal experts, joined by other specialists and stakeholders in the field, will discuss national accomplishments in combating risks to lives and property. Panelists also will address the possible future investments that have the greatest potential for reducing disaster vulnerability throughout the country. The Roundtable will be held at the National Academy of Sciences Building on Constitution Avenue on October 28th. To view the agenda or register, visit http://dels.nas.edu/dr/f12.html.

Dr. Whitney also discussed the July 28th meeting with Dan Dubno, senior technologist with CBS News, and announced that Mr. Dubno has agreed to return on December 7th for an SDR-sponsored media seminar. Mr. Dubno and other key representatives from the media and Federal agencies will address opportunities for improved communication between the media and citizens, and between Federal agencies and the media.

The memorandum for the heads of executive departments and agencies, "Updated Administration Research and Development Budget Priorities," was released by John Marburger, Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy, and Josh Bolten, Director of the Office of Management and Budget, on August 12th. The memo is designed to guide science and technology priorities on an interagency level. The memo does not address disaster reduction issues and members expressed concerns. Dr. Whitney acknowledged the concerns and reminded members of the opportunity to distribute a statement from Dr. Marburger in conjunction with International Day for Disaster Reduction (October 13th). A final draft of the Marburger statement was distributed to members for review.

The Interagency Working Group on Earth Observations (IWGEO) released their draft report yesterday. Copies are available in member packets or can be downloaded from the IWGEO website (http://iwgeo.ssc.nasa.gov/draftstrategicplan/ieos draft strategic plan.pdf).

C. Presentation by Chip Hines, DisasterHelp.gov

Mr. Chip Hines presented the goals and activities of the DisasterHelp.gov e-gov initiative. The purposes of the initiative are as follows:

- 1. To act as a portal of information and services for all disaster management agencies and personnel.
- 2. To provide interoperability, services and a basic toolset for incident management.
- 3. To assist with data management and transfer.

The system is designed to be used by responders at the state or local level and is designed to collect and share basic information about an incident. In the long-term, DisasterHelp.gov intends to develop a set of standards for data sharing and interoperability to enhance response effectiveness. D. International Working Group

Larry Roeder led the discussion of the International Working Group activities and opportunities. The group is leading the science and technology aspects of U.S. preparations for the World Conference on Disaster Reduction (Kobe, Japan, 18-22 January 2005) and produced a paper addressing key science and technology issues. Mr. Roeder requested short papers from each member identifying proposed conference outcomes for any area of interest to the U.S.

Mr. Roeder requested member comments on the U.S. National Report and the science and technology requirements document by September 28th. Members may propose additional panels for the World Conference, though the deadline is Wednesday, September 15th. Margaret Davison suggested a panel on risk communications. Susan Conard would like to see natural resources addressed.
