I. Call to Order

SDR Chair Helen Wood called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

II. Approval of Minutes

Members approved the November 4th meeting minutes.

III. Summary of Discussion

A. Reducing Tsunami Losses through Science and Technology

Dr. Kathie Olsen led the discussion of the impacts of the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami, and made several requests of the Subcommittee. Dr. Olsen began by congratulating the SDR for being a very active and well-organized group, and noted that those traits will be especially important when dealing with the challenges presented by the tsunami disaster. She stressed that it is crucial that all committees and working groups present a united front on Earth observations in the coming weeks, and said that Dr. Gene Whitney will deliver the same message to the Interagency Working Group on Earth Observations (IWGEO) following this meeting. The key question for National Science and Technology Council (NSTC) must answer: "Is the U.S. vulnerable?"

Although tsunamis are seen as a low probability/high impact disaster, the Indian Ocean had no warning system. Dr. Olsen emphasized that any warning system for the Indian Ocean must not be developed independently of the Global Earth Observation System of Systems (GEOSS), which is designed to be interactive among countries. Similarly, no one agency should act independently of all others. It is crucial that any work toward development of tsunami warning systems be part of a coordinated effort, with all agencies aware of what others are doing. NSTC will work with international agencies to bring together experts to link systems and coordinate a global Earth observations network.

NSTC will facilitate a full evaluation of U.S. vulnerability to tsunamis. Priscilla Nelson said that since this is such an extreme event, we have a responsibility not only to respond, but also to learn from it. Moreover, it is critical that social science experts also be involved. Dr. Olsen agreed, stating that social sciences are particularly important for understanding the public response to hazard warnings.

Dr. Olsen concluded by announcing that the white paper on tsunamis will be rewritten to include non-warnings information and also will include information on social science aspects. Members are encouraged to think about the lessons we can learn from this event and the ways in which they can be applied to future policies.

 David Applegate and Margaret Davidson will chair the Tsunami Lessons Learned Working Group. The draft outline will be presented to the SDR at the 3 February meeting.

B. Report from the NSTC Liaison

Dr. Gene Whitney echoed Dr. Olsen's comments by noting that a U.S. Government position paper on tsunami warning systems will be presented at the upcoming World Conference on Disaster Reduction (WCDR) in Kobe, Japan. The paper will go beyond simply addressing warnings to include other aspects of hazard management. He stated that we do know the warning system will be an expansion of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization/Intergovernmental Oceanic Commission (UNESCO/IOC) system and will be part of GEOSS. Dr. Whitney reminded the SDR that until the President is briefed we do not know what the level of U.S. commitment will be.

Dr. Whitney concluded his report by announcing that Helen Wood will extend her term as chair for another year, and OSTP appointed Dr. Dave Applegate to a three year term as vice-chair.

C. Report from the Chair

A U.S. tsunami position paper will be drafted for distribution to the delegates at the WCDR in Kobe, Japan. The Secretariat will prepare this by Monday, 10 January, building on the work done by NOAA tsunami experts Eddie Bernard and Laura Kong. This will be a very high-level position paper, addressing warnings and all other aspects of tsunami disaster reduction.

Actions

• The Secretariat will prepare a tsunami position paper for the WCDR by Monday, 10 January.

D. Grand Challenges

A new draft of the Grand Challenges for Disaster Reduction was presented to the members, including a sample of the full-color document layout. The tsunami disaster will be addressed in the executive summary, a hazard profile call-out box, and with one or more pictures scattered throughout the document.

Actions

- The Secretariat will prepare a final draft of the Grand Challenges, including new information on tsunami hazards.
- Members will submit final comments to Secretariat by 12 pm on Monday, 10 January.
