### **Meeting Notes**

The discussion began with introductions. Noel Raufaste and Priscilla Nelson provided background information on the Grand Challenges Task Group and discussed its purpose. Noel emphasized the unique nature of this interagency group, the opportunities to develop a presidential initiative, and the importance of seeking help within agencies. Gene Whitney noted that the GC final report will provide the context for S&T planning over the next ten years.

Noel also went over the timeline for the hazard teams, and explained the timeline and hazard grid. The information gathered by analyzing challenges and completing the hazard grids will be presented at the offsite in June, and will serve as a starting point for the draft GC document. Because the final document will require agency clearance, team leaders must note sources for each piece of information on the grid.

The group discussed team formation, and the need to make inter-agency contacts. Gene pointed out that team leaders should make an effort to include some contribution from FEMA, either by selecting people from FEMA as team members, or by interviewing them in the data gathering process. He also noted that non-federal employees can be used as resources in this phase of Grand Challenges. After Dennis Wenger raised the concern that there might not be enough of a focus on social science, Priscilla reminded the team leaders that every team should have at least one member with some background in social science.

Noel made the point that the final product will be a living document, and that there will be continual revisions to it. Given that, the group briefly discussed the possibility of a permanent staff responsible for advocating the implementation of measures detailed in the GC report.

Several team leaders expressed an interest in meeting before the hazard grids are due to discuss any possible questions or difficulties that arise. It was decided that there will be meetings on May 14 and May 28 at NSF for those who can attend; those meetings also will be conducted as teleconferences. After several people also indicated that they would not be able to attend an offsite on June 24, Priscilla and Noel decided to change the offsite date to June 18. Everyone at the meeting confirmed the date.
